1. Look at the six images. Discuss questions a-d below:

- What do you think of when you hear the word 'learning'? Name three things.
- What different learning environments and situations are shown in the images? Which is your favourite and why?
- Do you prefer learning alone or in groups? Why?
- What are some advantages and disadvantages to learning online? What about face-to-face lessons?



Interview: Learning English

2. Ask your partner the questions in the box. Write down their answer in your book/tablet.

Example answer: a. *I am learning English because I need it for my job and I want to help my daughter with her homework.*

- Why are you learning English?
- What do you like about learning English?
- What do you not like about learning English?
- What are three things you (can) do outside of the classroom to learn English?

- How you will learn English e.g. doing homework, creating and studying flashcards to revise vocabulary, reading/listening to the news in English,
- How will you keep track of your learning progress? E.g. write times for English in your calendar, learn with a friend.
